Church Initiates Plans for New Sanctuary Windows

At its February meeting, the church board will receive a request from the Stewards to initiate steps to replace the two large Sanctuary windows. Initial work on this project was put on hold in March of 2020 due to uncertainty generated during the early days of the pandemic. The sanctuary windows are in poor condition and because they are fiberglass, are not the type of windows that can be repaired.

Initial steps to be approved include naming a window committee, creation of a capital campaign fund for the windows, and plans for receiving input and ideas from the congregation. At this point the Window Committee will include two members from the Stewards Commission, the three members of the Church Decorating Committee, and one or two others. As reported in the January 29 Friday email, contractors that specialize in sanctuary windows are not numerous, but we are fortunate to have a highly skilled contractor located in the Valley. More information about that contractor will be forthcoming once the church board acts. We hope to have information meetings via zoom and in person later in the Spring.

Once the Board gives its permission to move forward, information concerning design, cost ranges, and timelines can be brought before the congregation as they are developed. No design plans are in place at this time and will not be until the congregation has an opportunity to contribute ideas and ask questions.

February Outreach Offering – Gideons International

Each month Montezuma has a different outreach or mission offering. In February 2021, this offering supports the Gideons International, an organization dedicated to making Bibles available to everyone and, together with local churches, reaching souls for Christ. Gideon Leon Rhodes will join Montezuma during worship for a brief mission emphasis on Sunday, February 28.

Deacon Bible Studies Continue

Montezuma Deacons are sponsoring a study of 1 John during the winter months. Two of the ten scheduled classes have been held, but there is still time to jump in if you have interest. Zoom classes are held every Thursday, both at 10 a.m. and at 7 p.m.. Contact David Miller if you want to participate in those. Two Sunday School classes are meeting via zoom: Cornerstone (young families, 1 John) meets at 11 a.m. on Sunday and the Footsteppers (various ages) also meets at 11 am on Sundays; they are working their way through the Sermon on the Mount. Lent begins February 17

This year's theme for Lent is Journey with Jesus. From Ash Wednesday on we walk with Jesus on a journey to the cross ... and beyond. Below are ways that Montezuma is focusing on Lent in 2021.

Email Daily Devotions

Montezuma will commence its Lenten daily devotional email on February 17 and continuing each day – accept Sundays – through April 3, which is Holy Saturday. Each email will contain a short Bible reading and a meditation for the day from someone here at Montezuma. If you want to write one, contact Pastor David asap! The theme is Journey with Jesus. We will send the Lenten emails to everyone. If you would like to opt-out of receiving this email, simply contact the church office.

Lenten Family Offerings

Before the pandemic Montezuma children contributed small change offerings each week to the Church of the Brethren's Global Food Initiative (GFI). This year we want to re-start supporting GFI through Montezuma's Lent meal offering. We recommend that families with children donate a nickel for every meal during the week. Twentyone meals equal \$1.05 a week. When Easter arrives, that will be over \$6 each child. But not just children; anyone in the congregation can participate. We plan on providing Lent Meal Offering boxes to families that want them. We start Ash Wednesday, February 17.

More about the Global Food Initiative: The GFI is the primary way the Church of the Brethren assists hungry people in developing food security. Since 1983 the COB has distributed over 8 million dollars through the GFI. Last year GFI supported projects in Haiti, Burundi, Ecuador, Nigeria, the Congo, and right here in the USA. The work varies from field farmer schools to orchard irrigation, to providing seeds for planting. Overseas and in the US, community gardens providing local food are a big focus. Why don't you join us?

Family & Youth Resources

Families with young children will receive a resource book for Lent. Each day offers a brief thought or occasionally a small project for the family. Parents of children and church youth will receive another resource, Steadfast Love, which highlights our Journey with Jesus using scripture and thoughts from Henri Nouwen.

Open Doors

Montezuma will provide meals to the Open Doors Thermal Shelter the Week of April 5-11. The Open Doors Committee has lined up meals for most nights at this point.
