## Maundy Thursday Service Planned for April 1

Montezuma Deacons will hold a Maundy Thursday communion service this spring rather than our traditional Love Feast. Pandemic restrictions make the foot washing ritual and the common meal ill-advised. Still, an observation of Jesus's last meal with the disciples is a necessary part of the church's worship life. The service will be held in the sanctuary at 7 p.m., Maundy Thursday, April 1. It will be available through live stream as well. The usual restrictions for worship gatherings at the meeting house will be observed: face coverings, social distancing, and no singing. These practices place limitations on our worship experience but for the time being are necessary.

The service will contain traditional elements of the Love Feast – including time for self-examination, corporate confession, and bread and cup communion that will be provided in prepackaged containers as worshipers enter the sanctuary. A brief enactment of Jesus washing the disciples' feet will be part of the service. Beyond those familiar elements, we will light candles as selections from the Sermon on the Mount are read; later in the service, these candles will be extinguished as we read portions from the Gospel describing Jesus's arrest, trial, and crucifixion.

The Church Board has approved a committee that will bring specific recommendations and plans for replacing the two large windows on the east and west walls of the sanctuary. Currently, the windowpanes are made of fiberglass and have deteriorated significantly over the last 46 years. The Sanctuary Window Committee is exploring costs and plans to replace the windows with glass and current technology. As plans develop, the congregation will be consulted and no decision to proceed with replacement will be made without congregational approval at a churchwide business meeting.

Still, two things are underway: first, the church board has established a window replacement fund to pay for the windows; second, we need ideas from the congregation for window design. What images, symbols or figures will be on these windows? We have two large windows, so we want to make wise use of that space. ## Lenten Food Drive for West Rockingham Food Pantry

The Witness Commission is sponsoring a special food drive to support the ministry of the West Rockingham Food Pantry. While Montezuma supports the Bridgewater Area Ministries Pantry, that pantry has experienced a significant drop-off in users over the last year. Other area pantries are busy and looking for support. A significant reason for increasing food insecurity is the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on jobs in specific sectors of the economy. For that reason, Montezuma will collect food during Lent to help West Rockingham.

This is a food collection offering only. Even a few items are helpful: peanut butter, jelly, cereal, soup, canned veggies & fruit and canned chicken & tuna are popular items. The pantry then supplements these items with bread, venison, beef, and other household staples that it supplies. Simply place your items in the coat nook on the right side of the entry way.
