Greetings Montezuma! On November 8 the Shenandoah District invites you to share in a worship service prepared especially for these times. Some background. I have served as Moderator of the Shenandoah District for the past year. Due to Covid-19, congregations have struggled with constantly changing circumstances, whether and where to meet, and how to make those meetings comfortable and worshipful. It's been a hard time for pastors and church leaders! When we decided it was not feasible to hold district conference in person, we wanted to communicate to district churches and pastors that we recognized their weariness and that we were supportive.

We decided to plan an all-district worship service for November 8 based on the theme we had chosen for 2020: "I am making all things new," from Revelation 21:5a. In this service we tell the stories of five congregations from across the district who are living out that theme during difficult times.

Exceptional music and a powerful sermon round out this hour-long service. Two pieces from the Montezuma Bell choir are featured; Leah Hileman from the Luray Church and Beth Jarrett from First Church Harrisonburg, sing songs they wrote specifically for this service! John Jantzi, our district executive minister, preaches on "The land between the rivers!" I hope that you will tune in with others to worship and celebrate God's powerful presence and promise in our midst.
